Mr. François Chimits is an analyst at the Mercator Institute for China Studies (MERICS), a nonprofit German think tank with a focus on China founded in 2013 by Stiftung Mercator. He is based in Brussels, where he contributed to the opening of the MERICS office there. He also holds a position at the Centre D'études Prospectives Et D'informations Internationales (CEPII) in Paris, a French research institute focused on international economics.

His research focuses on the economic development of China and its interactions with the rest of the world, especially European economies. More specifically, he focusses on foreign trade, economic security, finance and macro-policies of the PRC, as well as the related (re)actions by partners.

Before joining MERICS and CEPII, Francois worked as a macro-finance analyst at the French Embassy in Beijing. After that he was an economist and deputy head of the trade policy department at the French Ministry of Economy and Finance. He was also in charge of a course on Chinese economy at Sciences Po Paris. François received a Bachelor's degree in International Economics and Development and a Master's degree in International Economic Diagnosis and Development from Paris Dauphine University.
