In addition to his publications with RAND, Heath has published numerous articles and *The Autocrat's Predicament: The Political Peril of Economic Upgrade in Single Party Authoritarian Regimes* as well as contributions to *New Asian Disorder: Rivalries Embroiling the Pacific Century*. Fluent in Mandarin Chinese, he has extensive experience analyzing China's national strategy, politics, ideology, and military, as well as Asian regional security developments. He has a Ph.D. in political science from George Mason University and an M.A. in Asian studies from The George Washington University.
