Kyle Chan is a Postdoctoral Research Associate in the Sociology Department at Princeton University where he is also affiliated with the Paul and Marcia Wythes Center on Contemporary China and the M. S. Chadha Center for Global India. He is also an adjunct researcher at the RAND Corporation.

Dr. Chan's research focuses on industrial policy, clean technology, infrastructure, and development with a regional focus on China and India. His work has been published in peer-reviewed academic journals, including *Current Sociology* and *Asian Survey*. He has been interviewed by international media outlets, including the *Financial Times*, the *Wall Street Journal*, *Nikkei Asia*, and *Le Monde*. He is currently writing a book on China's industrial policy aimed at scholars and policymakers.

Dr. Chan holds a Ph.D. from Princeton University, where his dissertation focused on state-led railway infrastructure development in China and India drawing on several years of fieldwork in both countries. He holds a master's degree from the London School of Economics and a bachelor's degree from the University of Chicago.
