Dr. Sheena Chestnut Greitens

Associate Professor, University of Texas Austin



Sheena Chestnut Greitens is Associate Professor at the LBJ School of Public Affairs at the University of Texas at Austin, where she directs UT's Asia Policy Program and serves as editorin-chief of the Texas National Security Review. Dr. Chestnut Greitens currently serves as Visiting Associate Professor in Indo-Pacific Security at the U.S. Army War College's Strategic Studies Institute (China Landpower Studies Center), and is a Nonresident Scholar with the Asia Program at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

Dr. Chestnut Greitens' research and writing focus on security and authoritarian politics in East Asia. She is currently finishing a book on how internal security shapes Chinese grand strategy. She is the author of two previous books, Politics of the North Korean Diaspora (Cambridge 2023) and Dictators and Their Secret Police (Cambridge, 2016), which won multiple academic awards, and publishes widely in academic, policy, and media outlets. She previously served on the faculty at the University of Missouri (2015-2020), where she was the founding co-director of MU's Institute for Korean Studies. Chestnut Greitens received her PhD from Harvard University; an MPhil from Oxford University, where she studied as a Marshall Scholar; and a B.A. with honors from Stanford University.

Dr. Greitens last testified before the Commission in 2022 for the Commission's hearing on "Challenges from Chinese Policy in 2022: Zero-COVID, Ukraine, and Pacific Diplomacy."
