## Dr. Alvin Camba

Critical Materials Specialist, Association of Universities, Inc.



Dr. Alvin Camba, Ph.D., is a Critical Materials Specialist at the Association of Universities, Inc., where he works as part of the Beacons Project, a U.S. Department of Defense-funded initiative focused on critical resources and U.S. supply chains. He earned his doctorate in Sociology from Johns Hopkins University and is a widely published expert on China-Southeast Asia relations.

Dr. Camba has authored over 28 peer-reviewed publications, 17 policy reports, 14 book chapters, and more than 50 short-form essays. His work has received multiple best paper awards from academic organizations such as the International Studies Association, the American Sociological Association, and GRADNAS. He has also contributed to influential think tank policy papers, including the U.S. Institute of Peace's study on China and transnational crime, the International Republican Institute's report on China's disinformation strategies in the Philippines, and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace's research on how local elites leverage Chinese projects.

Beyond academia, Dr. Camba has served as the Principal Investigator for several internationally competitive grants. He has testified before or assisted the Philippine Senate and the International Criminal Court and has been featured in major media outlets, including The Economist, Financial Times, Bloomberg, The Wall Street Journal, and NPR. Additionally, he has briefed or presented his research at the EU Directorate-General for Environment, The World Bank, the U.S. State Department, AidData, and various U.S. intelligence agencies.
