Oriana Skylar Mastro is an assistant professor of security studies at the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University where her research addresses critical questions at the intersection of interstate conflict (in particular military strategy and operations), great power relations, and the challenges of rising powers – with a focus on China and East Asian security. This year, she is a Jeanne Kirkpatrick Scholar at the American Enterprise Institute where she is working on a book about China's approach to global leadership. Dr. Mastro also continues to serve as officer in the United States Air Force Reserve, for which she works as a Political Military Affairs Strategist at Pacific Air Forces. For her contributions to U.S. strategy in Asia, she won the Individual Reservist of the Year Award in 2016. She is the author of the forthcoming Cornell University press book, *The Cost of Conversation: Obstacles to Peace Talks in Wartime*.

Previously, Dr. Mastro was a Stanton Nuclear Security Fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations, fellow in the Asia-Pacific Security program at the Center for a New American Security, and a University of Virginia Miller Center National Fellow. She holds a B.A. in East Asian Studies from Stanford University and an M.A. and Ph.D. in Politics from Princeton University.
