Chin-Hao Huang is assistant professor of political science at Yale-NUS College. He specializes in international security, especially with regard to China and the Asia-Pacific region. He is the recipient of the 2014 American Political Science Association (APSA) Foreign Policy Section Best Paper Award for his work on China's compliance behavior in international security institutions. His field research has been supported by the United States Institute of Peace (USIP), UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO), MacArthur Foundation, Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the Rockefeller Foundation, among others. His articles have appeared in *The China Quarterly, International Peacekeeping*, and in edited volumes published through Oxford University Press and Routledge. Until 2009, he was a researcher at the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) in Sweden, and prior to that worked with the Freeman Chair in China Studies at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington, DC. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Southern California and B.S. with honors from Georgetown University.
