

Dr. Adam Hersh, Visiting Fellow, Columbia University

Dr. Hersh is a Visiting Fellow at Columbia University's Initiative for Policy Dialogue. Previously, he was Senior Economist at the Roosevelt Institute and the Center for American Progress. Dr. Hersh's current research focuses on Chinese economic reform and policy and the effects of trade and global economic governance on inequality and growth. His forthcoming report evaluates the progress of China's economic reforms against statutory market economy criteria. He publishes and is cited regularly in both academic and popular venues, and is a frequent commentator on economics and policy issues for a wide range of media outlets. He also regularly advises U.S. and international policymakers.

Dr. Hersh also previously taught macroeconomics and monetary and financial economics, and worked with the Asian Development Bank, the Political Economy Research Institute, the Center for Economic and Policy Research, and the Economic Policy Institute. He earned a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, and a B.A. in international political economy at the University of Puget Sound.

He testified before the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission in 2012 and 2014.
