

## Dr. Gary Clyde Hufbauer, Senior Fellow, Peterson Institute for International Economics

Dr. Hufbauer has served as the Reginald Jones Senior Fellow at the Peterson Institute since 1992. Previously he was the Maurice Greenberg Chair and Director of Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations from 1996 to 1998, the Marcus Wallenberg Professor of International Finance Diplomacy at Georgetown University from 1985 to 1992, senior fellow at the Peterson Institute from 1981 to 1985, deputy director of the International Law Institute at Georgetown University from 1979 to 1981, and deputy assistant secretary for international trade and investment policy of the U.S. Treasury from 1977 to 1979.

Dr. Hufbauer has written extensively on international trade, investment, and tax issues. He is coauthor of *Bridging the Pacific: Toward Free Trade and Investment between China and the United States* (2014), US-China Trade Disputes: Rising Tide, Rising Stakes (2006), and NAFTA Revisited: Achievements and Challenges (2005), among many others.

He holds an A.B from Harvard College, a Ph.D. in economics from King's College at Cambridge University, and a J.D. from Georgetown University Law Center.
