

Ben Shobert, Founder and Managing Director, Rubicon Strategy Group and Senior Associate for International Health, National Bureau of Asian Research

Mr. Shobert is affiliated with the National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR) to advise on aging, healthcare reforms and the pharmaceutical industry in China and Southeast Asia. His work on China's pursuit of a domestic life science sector was published last April as part of NBR's Global Life Sciences analysis. He is a member of the National Committee on US-China Relations and held advisory board seats at Indiana University's Research Center on Chinese Politics and Business as well as IAHSA-China. He was a member of the American Embassy's working group on senior care in China. In 2012, he became a member of the Pacific Council on International Policy.

For six years, Mr. Shobert wrote a column for the Asia Times on US-China policy matters. His work has been featured at CNBC, China Business Review, Fortune Magazine (China), Harvard Asia Quarterly, Yale University's China Hands, and others. He has appeared on a number of international TV programs including CCTV, CNBC Asia, CNN, and ABC World News. In late 2012, Mr. Shobert began writing at Forbes China and in 2013 began writing on healthcare and market access issues at Forbes. He is a contributor to the Routledge Publishing book, *The Global Obama*. His first book will be published in 2018 by Potomac Publishing House. It is tentatively titled: *Blame China: Might Feel Good, Won't Fix a Thing*.
